WINSOR COMMUNITY

The Winsor School is a 5–12 girls' school that values diversity, intellectual curiosity, authentic engagement, and personal integrity. Winsor is unwavering in its commitment to preparing young women to pursue their aspirations and contribute to the world. Located in Boston near Fenway Park and the Longwood Medical Area, the school attracts students from 55 towns in the greater Boston area.

Creating an environment of respect, equity, and inclusion is a matter of principle at Winsor. The Winsor community includes students of different races, religions, and nationalities. 53% of students in the Upper School identify as multiracial or students of color. 25.2% of the student body receives financial assistance.

GRADING SYSTEM AND CLASS RANK

Winsor does not provide a class rank and calculates an unweighted, cumulative (9–11) grade point average at the end of 11th grade. D is the lowest passing mark.

THE WINSOR ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The Winsor curriculum is demanding, with a college preparatory focus. Students typically take five academic core courses each year (not including the arts.) Of Winsor's 13 AP courses, three are in math, four are in science, and four are in world languages.

Winsor does not offer AP courses in history or English except for one semester of AP Macroeconomics. It is very rare for a student to be able to take more than four AP courses over their entire high school program.

Independent Learning Experience (ILE)

This required, full-credit senior course allows Winsor seniors to pursue a specific interest independently. Students design and complete their own projects, guided by a faculty seminar leader and a mentor/supervisor in an area of interest. The ILE culminates in presentations to their peers and the greater school community.

Global Studies

In either the fall or spring semester, juniors must take a pair of connected English and history courses focused on the history and literature of a specific global region. Options include Africa, India, the Middle East, Latin America, and Russia. In addition to coursework related to each discipline, students produce an 8-10 page original research paper on a chosen topic, which counts toward the final grade in both courses. This requirement supports the school's Principles of Global Responsibility.
